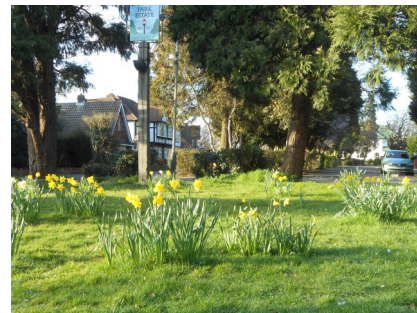
SUMMERTIME SECURITY

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REPORT ON 2018 AGM ON 16.5.18

Approx. 30 people attended our 2018 AGM.

There was a presentation on the plans for our new estate DVD by Ram Seth (see page 4 for more on this). The meeting agreed that the maximum length would be 2 hours and a maximum of approx 10% would be allocated to general Eastcote historical matters as these may impact the estate. The video will be in sections with narrators and hopefully some key content brought forward from the 1997 video.

The meeting thought a further annual dinner in 2019 would be appropriate.

The neighbourhood watch report noted that we had not had much in the way of burglaries in the last year but car crime was the issue we should be aware of. It was noted that the "OWL" neighbourhood watch system" was being rolled out with information emails on this to come from Chris Head to those on his circulation list in the near future. Chris was asked if he would retain emergency contact numbers for residents in case of fire or flood etc. The answer was yes although the OWL system may be a better way of holding such emergency contacts.

Accounts were presented and further copies are available from the Martin Hand on request.

Acorn youth club was approved as our charity for 2019 and all the existing committee and auditors were re-elected.

Subscriptions

Road Stewards have now completed their collections. 84% of our residents have already subscribed for 2018. Subscription remain at £3.00 for each residence but we also invite a donation which will be for The Acorn Youth Club. OWL neighbourhood watch system

OWL is a system set up by the police through neighbourhood watch. Further information will follow from Chris Head but the key points are:

Local authorities send out alerts via OWL about crime & local issues happening right now in your area. It helps prevent burglary, finds missing people, makes people feel safer, and even catches suspects.

OWL helps reduce crime and keeps people informed of what's going on locally. It's a shared, secure platform for the public and local authorities to maximise the potential of Neighbourhood Watch, Rural Watch, Business Watch and dozens of other schemes. OWL sends you the latest local crime alerts and provides management tools for maintaining and expanding watches.

ROAD STEWARD REQUIRED

Celebrating the RAF and Hillingdon's History

This year is the 100 year anniversary of the creation of the Royal Air force (RAF). This is an anniversary that has particular significance to the London Borough of Hillingdon. Our history is so intertwined with the RAF's that the eagle on the Hillingdon coat of arms specifically denotes our area's connections with the RAF.

Most famously, RAF Uxbridge headquartered No. 11 Group RAF, which was responsible for the aerial defence of London and the south-east of England during the Battle of Britain. The Operations Room was also responsible for providing air support during the evacuation of Dunkirk in May 1940 (Operation Dynamo) and the D-Day landings (Operation Overlord). It was in the site's bunker that Winston Churchill first said, "Never in the history of mankind has so much been owed by so many to so few". If you want to find out more the Battle of Britain Bunker museum is just off St Andrew's Road, Uxbridge.



To mark the anniversary, during June Uxbridge town centre will host the RAF Freedom of Hillingdon Parade. Up until October free talks will be presented by personnel from RAF Northolt, at libraries across the Hillingdon. To find out when these will happen search "RAF 100 Talk series" on the Hillingdon Council website.

My Grandad, after he escaped from the Nazi invasion of Poland, flew Lancaster Bombers for the RAF. I have always felt proud that he did so, to help make sure we stayed free. I also feel fortunate that my generation has never had to face such a great challenge. It is always good to remember what previous generations have done for us.
