AUTUMN PLANTING



The committee will not be planting bulbs this year. However should any residents wish to form a small group to plant bulbs on any of the grassy islands of our estate the committee will provide them with bulbs to plant. Should you be interested in doing some island planting then please let one of the committee know in advance so we can ensure there is no duplication and then provide you with the bulbs.

The relevant islands are:

1. At the junction of St Lawrence Drive and Rodney Gardens around numbers 51 to 61.

2. In Rodney Gardens between numbers47 to 47 and 66 to 68.

In Rodney Gardens between numbers
39 to 41 and 50 to 60.

4. At the junction of Rodney and Burwood by 9 Rodney and 47 Burwood.

5. In Burwood Avenue between numbers40 to 42 and 27 to 37.

6. In Burwood Avenue between numbers7 to 9 and 14 to 22.

7. The main entrance island at the junction of St Lawrence Dr. and Bridle Road.8. At the junction of St Lawrence and The Glen (The oak tree island).

The junction of Pamela Gardens and Field End Road is excluded due to fast moving adjacent traffic.

Planting time will be in October/ November. Please ensure social distancing is observed as well as care to avoid any traffic. Good luck and thanks to all those who volunteer.
