Please bring your own picnic and drinks, plus plates, cups, cutlery etc.. The council has confirmed that alcohol is allowed, so beer and wine is fine. We will NOT be providing any food or drink, just cold squash in case it is a hot day. The café will be open its normal hours.

We will supply a few garden chairs for our older residents, or those who have difficulty getting down onto a picnic rug. More able residents should bring their own if they wish. There will be a couple of gazebos in case anyone needs to sit in the shade or hide from a shower.

The event is free for EPEA residents and family members (including grandchildren) who are welcome to join us. All children attending our gathering need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian who will remain responsible for their safety and well being. We will have activities for children such as a craft table, a duck race, rounders and garden games.

REPORT ON OUR 2024 AGM HELD 8.5.2024

20 people attended our AGM this year.

Mark Lemon stood in for our Chairman and reported on the success of our Coronation event and quiz night in 2023 as well as on Neighbourhood watch issues. He also noted that membership in 2023 was 81% of our 254 homes and we hope to increase this towards 90% in 2024.

It was reported that the EPEA 65+ group had 12 meetings in 2023 with an average attendance of just a few decimal points less than 18.

The treasurer reported on a deficit for 2023 of £354.24 and the closing fund or £3,080.90. A donation of £794.50 from welfare collections plus £270.92 from the coronation event was made to the Acorn Youth club. A copy of the income and expenditure account is available in the About EPEA/AGMs section of our website and can be obtained from the treasurer.

It was agreed that Acorn youth club would be our nominated charity again for 2025. All the 10 existing committee members were reappointed and our auditor, Bhavini Mathews, was reappointed.

There was a discussion on changes in planning restrictions.

It was noted that, should anyone be interested in joining the EPEA committee, they can contact any member of the committee to discuss.

EPEA 65+ SOCIAL GROUP

Our social group for EPEA residents/ members who have reached 65 years of age is continuing to meet on a monthly basis. We are getting close to our target attendance and membership but would still like a few more members to join us. Recent attendances have averaged 20 (approx. 50% of members each month).

Recent newsletters have mentioned the sort of activities we have. A bit of history

We continue to be fortunate to have so much green space around us particularly with Eastcote House Gardens, Long Meadow and Ruislip Woods. However the situation was a bit greener 120 years ago. A quote from the Middlesex and Buckinghamshire Advertiser of July 2nd 1904 reporting on the opening of a local section of the Metropolitan Line is given on Page 21 of Ron Edwards Book "Eastcote from village to a Suburb". This reads:

Indeed the country between Harrow and Uxbridge is beautiful in the extreme. On Thursday, bathed in glori-



ous sunshine, and scented with new mown hay, the countryside was at its best. Here stretches of meadowland with herds of sleek cattle grazing lazily, there the clink and rattle of the grass cutting machines. Again, to mark as it were, the rural aspect of the new line, plump partridges raised their startled heads and a pheasant, with its glorious plumage shining like burnished gold ran to cover. And all this almost within the sound of Bow Bells.
